<u>MOTION TO ADOPT</u> Resolution Amending the Broward County Administrative Code, the title of which is as follows:

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO THE OFFICE OF FILM AND TO FILM, TELEVISION, AND MEDIA INCENTIVE PROGRAMS; AMENDING SECTIONS 13.41 THROUGH 13.45 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE ("ADMINISTRATIVE CODE"); AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Summary Explanation/Background

This item supports the Board's values of "[c]ultivating community culture, arts, recreation, and lifelong learning" and "[e]nsuring economic opportunities for Broward's diverse population and businesses." This item further supports the Board's Goals of: (1) "[p]rovid[ing] diverse artistic, cultural, educational, and historical amenities and programs

that contribute to a vibrant, multicultural and economically viable community. . ."; and (2) "[d]iversify[ing] the local economy, attract[ing] industries offering high wage jobs with benefits while balancing economic, educational, environmental, and community needs."

On November 4, 2021, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2021-518, creating an Office of Film and establishing film, television, and entertainment production project incentive programs ("Incentive Programs") to provide funding to film, television, and entertainment production companies that bring their activities to Broward County and/or the South Florida region.

After the Board created the Office of Film and the Incentive Programs, the County hired a Film Commissioner who is recommending modifications to the Incentive Programs to better enable the County to compete for opportunities to bring film, television, and entertainment productions to Broward County.

The proposed Resolution, in addition to modifying the Incentive Programs, also renames the Office of Film as the "Broward County Film Commission," which later intends to also brand itself for marketing purposes as "Film Lauderdale."

This public hearing has been advertised with adequate notice to allow the Board's consideration of this item on June 7, 2022.

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OF RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA. RTAINING TO THE OFFICE OF FILM AND TELEVISION. AND MEDIA INCENTIVE PROGRAMS AMENDING SECTIONS 13.41 THROUGH 13.45 OF THE BROWARD ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTY ("ADMINISTRATIVE CODE"); AND PROVIDING FC SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE ADMINISTRATIV CODE" CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

8 WHEREAS, on November 4, 2021, the Broward County Board of County
9 Commissioners ("Board") adopted Resolution No. 2021-518, creating an Office of Film
10 and establishing film, television, and entertainment production project incentive programs
11 ("Incentive Programs") to provide funding to film, television, and entertainment production
12 companies that bring their activities to Broward County and/or the South Florida region;

WHEREAS, Sections 13.41 through 13.45 of the Broward County Administrative
Code ("Administrative Code") create the Office of Film and the Film Commissioner as the
head of that Office, and prescribe the manner in which the film, television, and
entertainment production project incentives are awarded;

WHEREAS, after receiving feedback from the Film Commissioner, the Board
desires to amend the Administrative Code to modify the name of the Office of Film, and
to revise certain requirements of the Incentive Program, NOW, THEREFORE,

The Film Commissioner shall have, at a minimum, the 17 following qualifications: (i) a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university 18 with major coursework in film, marketing, business, public relations, public administration, 19 or a closely related field; and (ii) six (6) years of experience managing film, television, or 20 media operations, or closely related experience. Two (2) additional years of relevant 21 experience above the minimum specified in (ii) may be substituted for each required year 22 of education and the bachelor's degree (for example, a total of ten (10) years of relevant 23 experience requires two (2) years of college courses in the specified fields). 24 The Office of Broward County Film Commission shall: (b) Coding: Words in struck-through type are deletions from existing text. 7	(a) Incentives Generally. To incentivize television, film, and entertainment		
8	production projects in Broward County ("County") and South Florida more generally and		
9	subject to the provisions of this section and other policies adopted by the County pursuant		
10	hereto, the County authorizes the creation of various programs to award of monetary		
11	incentives to fund eligible Productions ("Incentives"). All incentive programs referenced		
12	below are collectively referred to as "Incentive Programs."		
13			
14	(c) <i>Definitions</i> . As used herein, the following terms shall have the following		
15	meanings:

17	<i>Crew</i> means a group of people hired by a production company for the purpose of		
18	producing a film, motion picture, television, video, or digital media project. The crew		
19	includes "above-the-line" personnel such as directors, screenwriters, and producers, and		
20	"below-the-line" individuals involved with the production stage, such as production		
21	assistants, grips, soundstage personnel, and camera operators.		
22	Film Commission means the Broward County Film Commission.		
23	Film Commissioner means the head of the Office of Film for Broward County		
24	Commission.		
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Incentive Guidelines means the published guidelines for each Incentive pProgram,
 created by the Office Film Commission and approved by the County Administrator, which
 guidelines include the terms and conditions for that each Incentive pProgram, the specific
 approved uses for the applicable Incentives, and any application deadline(s) for seeking
 each Incentive.

Production means an Incentive-eligible: theatrical or direct-to-video motion picture;
a made-for-television motion picture; visual effects or digital animation sequences
produced in conjunction with a motion picture; a commercial; an industrial or educational
film; a documentary film; a television pilot program; a presentation for a television pilot
program; a television series; or a digital media project by the entertainment industry. This
definition does not include any production that is deemed obscene under Chapter 847,
Florida Statutes.

Production Days mean the combined number of days used to create a Production,
 including time spent during pre-production, days spent on-site making the Production,
 and days spent post-filming on the Production, including, but not limited to, editing and
 other post-production work required to bring the Production to final completion.

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(d) Eligibility Generally; Funding.

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(3) If an Incentive is funded in whole or in part with Tourist Development Tax funds, in addition to all other eligibility requirements, the Production must meet the eligibility requirements of, and the recipient must comply with,

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1		Section 125.0104, Florida Statutes, and any applicable policies,	
2		procedures, and guidelines imposed by the Office of Film Commission.	
3	<u>(4)</u>	If more than one (1) Incentive Program is offered by the County, a	
4		Production may apply for multiple Incentive Programs, but is only eligible to	
5		be awarded one (1) Incentive from the Film Commission for any fiscal year.	
6		Nothing in this section prohibits a Producer or Production from applying for	
7		any other grant, incentive, or funding from the County, the funding for which	
8		is subject to the guidelines, terms, and conditions of the applicable	
9		program(s).	
10	(e)	The Office of Film shall publish the Incentive Guidelines, approved by the	
11	County Admi	inistrator, at least thirty (30) days prior to any applicable deadline to apply for	
12	the Incentive. The Office of Film shall review all timely submitted applications to confirm		
13	compliance with the applicable terms of the Incentive Guidelines and to ensure the		
14	applicants have included all required documentation. All Incentives for which no		
15	application deadline is established shall be considered and awarded on a rolling basis		
16	throughout the County's fiscal year.

22	(a)	On an annual basis, after approval thereof by the County Administrator, the

24	be posted a	t least thirty (30) days prior to the applicable deadline to apply for the	
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Incentive. The Film Commission shall review all timely submitted applications to confirm
 compliance with the applicable Incentive Guidelines and to ensure the applicants have
 included all required documentation. Incentives for which no application deadline is
 established may be considered and awarded on a rolling basis throughout the County's
 fiscal year.

6 (b) All Incentive Programs must include as an eligibility requirement that
7 Qualified Broward County Residents involved in the Production are paid, at a minimum,
8 the rate as provided in Section 26-102, Broward County Code of Ordinances, as may be
9 amended.

(c) The Incentive Guidelines shall provide for general and specific eligibility
 requirements for each Incentive Program for that fiscal year, including, without limitation:

- 12 (1) The Incentive amounts that may be awarded for each Incentive Program
 13 (either in dollars, a percentage of eligible Production costs, or a combination
 14 thereof);
- 15 (2) The minimum number of Production Days that a Production must be
 16 produced and/or filmed within Broward County;

17 (3) The minimum percentages and/or numbers of Cast and Crew hired for the
18 Production that must be Qualified Broward County Residents, Qualified
19 Miami-Dade County Residents, and/or Qualified Palm Beach County
20 Residents;

(4) The minimum percentages of Vendors/Contractors hired for the Production
 that are Broward County Registered Businesses, County Business
 Enterprises (as defined in the "Broward County Business Opportunity Act,"
 Section 1-81.1, et seq., Broward County Code of Ordinances), Miami-Dade

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- County Registered Businesses, and/or Palm Beach County Registered Businesses;

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- Any required minimum amount the Producer must spend in Broward County on the Production; and
- (6) Any additional conditions for the Incentive Programs deemed appropriateby the Film Commissioner and approved by the County Administrator.

7 (d) It is the intention of the Board to enter into one or more interlocal 8 agreements with Miami-Dade County and/or Palm Beach County to create a combined 9 South Florida regional film, television, and entertainment incentive program. If Broward 10 County enters into such interlocal agreements with Miami-Dade County, Palm Beach 11 County, or both, the wage information in Section (b) shall automatically be modified to 12 also require that any Qualified Miami-Dade County Residents are paid, at a minimum, the 13 same rate as provided in Section 2-8.9, Miami-Dade County Code, as may be amended; 14 and any Qualified Palm Beach County Residents are paid, at a minimum, the same rate 15 as provided in Section 2-148, Palm Beach County Code, as may be amended.

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Section 5. Section 13.45 of the Broward County Administrative Code is herebyamended to read as follows:

13.45. Agreements; Reports to the Board.

20 . . .

(f) *Reports*. The Office of Film Commission shall prepare and file semiannual
reports to the Board. Each semiannual report shall include the following: details on each
<u>Incentive Program available during the reporting period</u>; the number of Incentives
approved during the reporting period and the approved amount for each Incentive

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awarded; the execution date of each Incentive Agreement executed during the reporting
 period; for each Incentive <u>Program</u>, the <u>aggregate</u> amount paid to date; and for the Office
 of Film <u>Commission</u>, the total amount <u>of Incentives</u> paid during the reporting period.

Section 6. <u>Severability</u>.

If any portion of this Administrative Code Resolution is determined by any court to
be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity
of the remainder of this Administrative Code Resolution. If any court determines that this
Administrative Code Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any
individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the
applicability of this Administrative Code Resolution to any other individual, group, entity,
property, or circumstance.

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Section 7. Inclusion in the Broward County Administrative Code.

15 It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this
Administrative Code Resolution become part of the Broward County Administrative Code
17 as of the effective date. The sections of this Administrative Code Resolution may be
18 renumbered or relettered and the word "resolution" may be changed to "section," "article,"
19 or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish
20 such intention.


